Looking Back at DIVERSEartPB 2023, Gallery News and more...

As we gear up for Art Palm Beach 2024, we'd like to highlight a few of the standout exhibitions presented as part of the first editions of DIVERSEartPB this year. Read on for exciting gallery news from one of our new exhibitors, Cernuda Arte, and returning exhibitor, Ethan Cohen Gallery.

Gallery Highlight: Cernuda Arte

We look forward to welcoming Cernuda Arte as an exhibiting gallery next year. Based in the Coral Gables area of Miami, the gallery has 25 years of expertise in presenting the complete spectrum of Cuban art spanning the Colonial, Early Republic, Vanguardia and Modern master painters – as well as fine artworks by contemporary artists. For Art Palm Beach 2024, Cernuda Arte will showcase an engaging exhibition of work by a number of Cuban artists: Wilfredo Lam, René Pontocarrero, Manuel Mendive, Danuel Méndez, Lilian Garcia-Roig, Miguel Florido, Gina Pellón and Enrique Casas.

Currently, the gallery is presenting two concurrent exhibitions: Important Modern Masters and Important Contemporary Masters. Both exhibitions feature a curated selection of more than 200 Modern & Contemporary paintings and sculptures by internationally renowned and upcoming Cuban artists, including Wifredo Lam, René Portocarrero, Amelia Peláez, Manuel Mendive, Tomás Sánchez and Roberto Fabelo. This ambitious exhibition encompasses more than 100 years of creative production. Many of the works exhibited are featured in the gallery's most recent, 179-page publication, *Important Cuban Artworks*, Volume Nineteen.



Gallery Highlight: Ethan Cohen Gallery

We're delighted Ethan Cohen Gallery will join us again as an exhibitor in 2024. The New York art gallery focuses on innovation in contemporary art across disciplines and countries. Currently, the gallery is presenting the exhibition, Innocent Nkurunziza: From Rwanda with Love. A leading Rwandan artist, Nkurunziza creates artworks that straddle the continuum between sculpture and painting. Through his work, the artist endeavors to shift perceptions about Rwanda as a country evolving away from tragedy to one of creativity.



Innocent Nkurunziza: From Rwanda with Love

Foraging for materials on hillsides, Nkurunziza harvests his paints from nature, and for his canvas, uses tree bark which he treats with the five elements, air, fire, earth, water and time. His process – which he invests with meditation and prayer – involves a kind of ritual he describes as, *slow art*. His barkcloth backgrounds palpate the natural dyes he massages on like organic muds. Time-induced drying results in contours and ridges which he exploits to inspire the direction of the work. His textured surfaces are like sculpted textiles, which the artist refers to as, *nature*'s *bandages*. They may resemble three-dimensional maps, river-deltas, dried lava flows or cracked fingerprints.



Innocent Nkurunziza: From Rwanda with Love

Nkurunziza's sculptures explore the confluent identities of bark and lava skin, imitating the process of volcanic flow as it bubbles, craters and cools. The show continues through June 30, 2023. More here.

We're proud that the inaugural edition of DIVERSEartPB was so well received and had such broad impact on visitors to Art Palm Beach and viewers of the extensive news coverage we received in print and broadcast media. The 2023 curatorial focus involved museums, art institutions and non-profits with local and global communities geared to raise awareness about climate change, with an emphasis on water and sea level rise. By bringing together leading art experts and scientific figures, our goal is to generate innovative ideas and drive social change through art.

"The echo of oblivion" Presented by 2b Non Profit Organization (Miami)

A collective project by **Guillermo Anselmo Vezzosi** (Visual Artist/Architect), **Dr. Eric Larour** (Scientist V and Group Supervisor for the Sea Level and Ice Group in the Earth Sciences Section at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory — JPL/NASA). Video project developed with the collaboration of José Luis Bongiovanni (Entrenautas)

In this dynamic video, scientific data and art merge, transforming information to reach victims of oblivion. The desire to exist pushes through in an attempt to reach the future, triggering the marriage between art and science. The scene evolves into a stable and dynamic melting background in liquid form, permeating its surroundings. A series of lines floating over space evoke another presence where past, present and future meet.

Navarro and Domínguez use a conceptual approach in their artwork, as they seek to

involve viewers in a sensory experience, inviting them to reflect on issues that have an impact on the relationships between the individual, urban space and society.

Marcos Lutyens is a British interdisciplinary artist and author based in Los Angeles. His artworks seek to disrupt internalized patterns of thinking, associations and ways of existing in the world. Through his artistic practice, involving installations, sculptures, drawings, short films, writings and performances, Lutyens targets the psychic and emotional well-being of his audiences by skillfully leading participants in hypnotic exercises that affect the deepest levels of their psyche.


Art Palm Beach in the News!
