The Echo of Oblivion

Artists: Guillermo Anselmo Vezzosi and Dr. Eric Larour **Presented By:** 2b Non Profit Organization (Miami)

This collaborative project between artist/architect Vezzosi and NASA JPL scientist Larour explored the concept of time as a succession of events inevitably moving toward oblivion. The marriage of scientific data and art created a dynamic work where past, present, and future converge against the silent presence of oblivion.



Ceramic Plates Collection

This fascinating collection showcased unique ceramic plates primarily created by Cuban artists and recently expanded to include creators from across the continent. The collection, one of the largest of its kind, featured nearly a thousand hand-painted plates by over 100 renowned artists from the Fine Arts Ceramic Center.




